Mr. Ray Hnatyshyn (Saskatoon-Biggar): Mr. Speaker, I do not have very much time. In the few moments remaining I want to put a little perspective on what we are talking about in this debate.

Whenever the government is in a difficult position, ministers rely on their good friends and colleagues to my left who are prepared to support them on any policy, including their profligate spending habits, regardless of the consequences.

We in the Conservative party are concerned about the social conscience of the people of this country, about the extent of the debt that has been developed through mismanagement of affairs by this government. That has to be taken into consideration. We should look at the programs in this country that we cannot afford because of the activities and practices of this government.

This government got into difficulty at the time of the minority government from 1972 to 1974. We had 19 occasions when my friends on the left supported the government and kept it in office. It reminds me of a story about Noah's ark that the hon. member for Nanaimo-Cowichan-The Islands (Mr. Douglas) likes to talk about. It reminds me of the time when Noah was standing at the ark and they wanted to make sure that there were no births on the ark, so he put the giraffes in charge to make sure there was no fooling around. Of course what happened was, when the waters came and went, Noah was standing at the ark and the animals came off in pairs, and finally he noticed that although two cats went on, there were 19 kittens following behind, when debarking. Noah went up to the giraffes and said, "What in heaven's name is going on? What happened?" One giraffe said "I don't know. I thought they were fighting." That is the situation we have now with the NDP.
