McGill University, Montreal. Dear Sir Arthur:-A member of my staff, Mr. O. G. Moore covers McGill, was informed by Dr. G. R. Lomer of Redpath Library that no further information would be given to The Herald, because a story had appeared in our paper before permission for the release had been given by him. The story referred to the pending grant of \$15,000 from the Carnegie Institute to the Redpath Library. It did not come from Dr. Lomer, nor from any member of McGill faculty or staff. Mr. Moore discussed the matter with Dr. Lomer and told him all the facts were in our possession, and Dr. Lomer will bear him out that this is so. While, I have always instructed the staff to be most careful to fall in with the wishes of the faculty in the matter of news, I do not feel that my hands are tied from publishing stories which emanate outside the University, unless, of course, I have a direct request from yourself and Colonel Bovey that, for reasons known to yourselves they should not be published. I should be glad if you would take up this matter with Dr. Lomer and remove the ban, or at least clear up the misunderstanding. Am sending a copy of this letter to Dr. Lomer.
