The following articles shall be prohibited to be imported under a penalty of two bundred dollars, together with the forfeiture of the parcel or package of goods in which the same may be found, Books, printed paper, drawings, paintings, prints, photographs or representations of any kind, of a treasonable or seditious, or of an improval or indecent character. Reprints ... Canadian copyright works, and reprints of British copyright works which have been also copyrighted in Canada, unfolise Coin; base or counterfeit. The importation into Canada of all goods manufactured or produced, wholly or in part, by prison labor, or which have been made within, or in connection with any prison, gaol or penitentiary, is hereby prohibited under a penalty of two hundred dollars, together with the forfeiture of such goods, and the parcels or packages in which they are contained.

The importation and manufacture of oleomagarine, butterine, and all such substitutes for butter is hereby prohibited, under a penalty of not less than two hundred nor more than four hundred dollars for each offence, and the forfeiture of such goods, and of all packages in which they are contained. EXPORTS PROHIBITED.

The export of deer, wild turkeys, quail, partridge, prairie fowl and woodcock, in the carcass, or parts thereof is hereby declared unlawful and prohibited, and any person exporting or attempting to export any such article shall, for each such offence, incur a penalty of one hundred dollare, and the article so attempted to be exported shall be forfeited, and may, on rasconable cause of suspicion of intention to export the same, be seized by any officer of the Customs, and if such intention be proved, shall be dealt with as for breach of the Customs laws.
