\$2,100.00 had to be put on the building. Of this amount \$900.00 was paid in cash and a second mortgage of \$1,200.00 placed on the church property.

October 19th, 1904, Rev. A. J. Vincent accepted the pastorate of this church, at a period which was perhaps the most critical in its history. Surrounded by many difficulties, the future did not look bright or promising, but under the leadership of the Divine Spirit, Mr. Vincent was enabled to bring the Church safely through all her difficulties, up out of the valley of shadows, into the mountain top experience of a happy united people, working together for the glory of God and the advancement of the Redeemer's Kingdom.

When Mr. Vincent resigned the pastorate, September 30, 1911 he left the church in many respects, pernaps, in a better condition than at any time in its history. He baptized and received into this church one hundred and seven members. During Mr. Vincent's pastorate, the lot south, adjoing the church, was secured at an outlay of \$400.00. The second mortgage of \$1,200.00 was burned and \$800.00 raised toward payment of the first mortgage.

Rev. E. E. Daly was called to the pastorate of this church, October 1st, 1911. And what shall we say of him? For he is here with us. Simply this. That we believe he is respected in the community, he is beloved by his people and God has blessed his work, and through his instrumentality twenty-six members have been added to the church, a total of 659 in the history of the church. In this period four young men have gone forth as preachers of the gospel.
