\*\* Nations, whom he knew, and had seen at Oswego or at their Head Quarters, and who did then profess themselves Friends to the English; he further declares, that two Officers formerly of Colonel Schuyler's Regiment, who were taken Prisoners last Summer on Lake George, when employed upon a Party under the Command of Lieutenant Colonel Parker, told him at Quebec, that there were between three and four hundred Indians of the before-named Tribes among the Enemy's Party, which took them Prisoners."
