THE undersigned, having joined a Citizens' Committee for the purpose of protesting against the proposed bylaw prohibiting the use of the public toboggan slides on Sunday, herewith petition each Member of the Council to vote against the said by-law.

VOUR petitioners are strongly of the opinion-which they feel confident is shared by a large majority of the electorate-that the harmless recreation of Sunday tobogganing is in no way detrimental to either the religion or morals of the people, and any attempt to withdraw this liberty may result in a loss of respect for both law and religion, and is withal not in the best interests of the community.

TE would respectfully point out that those who have the time and means may and do enjoy motoring, riding, golfing and kindred recreations on Sundays, while the proposed by-law would deprive of open air and exercise those whose week-day occupations confine them to office, store and factory, and who have not the means to make use of the private clubs and more expensive forms of Sunday outing.
