During the year the sarsaparilla as it was made and sold by Dr. J. C. Ayer 50 years rate of interest was lowered to 5 per cent. and freely met when due. It was resolved to try and reduce the morigage by \$1000, towards which two friends promised a third of the amount on condition the other two-thirds was raised. 
