LAURIE'S SHOCKING DEATH.

Mangled by the Trolley, He Died in St. Michael's Hospital.

At Lombard and Church-Streets He Was Caught by the Motor and Thrown Underneath—A Well-Known Toronto Printer—His Terrible Injuries—Inquest Ordered.

Last evening a few minutes after 6 o'clock, when the streets were crowded with people hurrying home from work, a trolley occurred at the corner of Church and Lombard-streets.

He left the full at 6 o'clock with the rest of the employes, and walked across the street, where, without looking either way, he started to walk across the street.

ALARMING NEWS.

Financial Crisis Reported in Peru—Ultimatum Sent to Argentine Government.

Lima, Peru, July 7.—via Caldwell.—Alarming news has been received here from Chile. Owing to the financial conditions a run on gold commenced on the banks, and thereupon the Government closed the banks for five days.

How the Accident Occurred.

The oncoming car was running at a moderate rate of speed, and the motorman John Piper, seeing Laurie attempting to pass in front, called to him to get out of the way, but, instead, Laurie walked on.

Willing hands were soon busy in trying to extricate the injured man.

On the following car Dr. English of London, a delegate to the Railway Surgeons, was a passenger, and, with others, he lifted the mangled body on to the sidewalk, and the ambulance was immediately called.

He Died at St. Michael's.

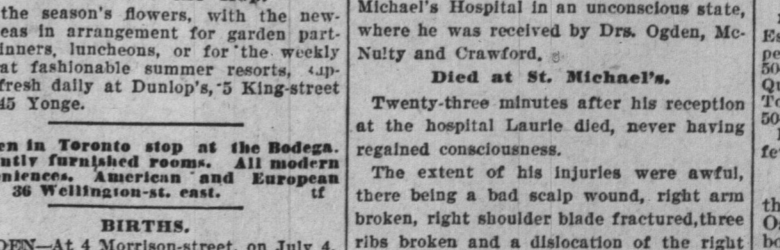
Twenty-three minutes after his reception at the hospital Laurie died, never having regained consciousness.
