FOUR FAVORITES FIRST AND TWO SECOND CHOICES

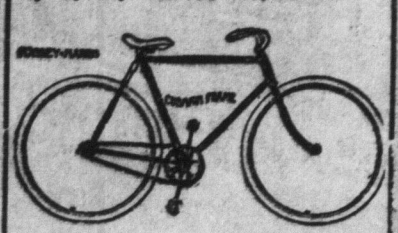
Friday at Brighton Beach—Crack Field in Handicap Race To-day.
