The commissioners feel that the new reservoir is needed in order to facilitate making provision for emergencies arising out of an exceptionally large demand for water. Chairman Philip Pocock pointed out that under present conditions the commission is restricted by the limitations of the capacity of the well from which the water is pumped, which aggregates about six and a half million gallons a day. The present reservoir holds only that amount, so that the storing of an adequate surplus against emergency is impossible.
