



TO CONFER ON FUEL Ottawa Sends Two Commis-

GO TO WASHINTON

sioners-Indicates Seriousness of Problem.

Ottawa, July 15 .- (By Canadian Press) .- The sudden departure for Washington this afternoon of Chief Commissioner Carvell and Cor sioner McLean of the railway board to confer with the United States interto the fuel situation in Canada and the

United States is an indication of the serious view of the coal problem taken by the Dominion and United States authorities. The trip to Washington is being made on the invitation of the interstate commerce commission, which apparently is dealing with the fuel shortage, which is also felt in the states across the border.

The Canadian commissioners will arrive in Washington Friday night and the conference will be commenced on Saturday. They are not expected back in Ottawa until Tuesday next.

Hold Up Board's Order.

The Dominion Railway Board had the Canadian fuel situation under review on Wednesday, and it was expected that its first order would have been issued today, but no order will now be forthcoming until after the Washington conference. The order under consideration, it is understood, provided for the prohibition of export of Canadian coal, except to the United States and Newfoundland, and the stopping of bunkering with imported United States coal, co-operative measures which will doubtless meet with the approval of the Washington authorities.

TREACHEROUS USE OF WHITE FLAG

Turks at Brusa Killed Greek Envey and Commander Opened Fire.

Constantinople, July 15.-Majer Venizelos, son of the Greek pre commanded the artillery of the Greek corces which recently entered Brusa.

As the Greeks approached the city the Nationalists waved a white flag, but treacherously killed a Greek who was sent to confer with them. Thereupon Major Venizelos ordered the artillery to open fire, killing many Turks
and quieting all opposition, so that
the Greek flag was hoisted speedily
over the town hall of the most historic city of the Osmanlis, where Mohammed I. and several other sultans
are huried.

Greeks Beyond Brusa
Smyrna, July 15.—An official communique issued from army headquarters today says that the advance guard of the Greek forces has reached a line 15 kilometres beyond Brusa.
"We annihilated the enemy entrenched in the region of Brusa, capturing all his artillery," the statement adds.

DE VALERA WILL PLAN **EDUCATION CAMPAIGN**

New York, July 15.—Bamonn de Valera, se-called "president of the Irish republic," will arrive here tomorrow from Chicago, and will begin plans for a new education campaign in the United States. It is understood this campaign will be carried on for several months.

De Valera's advisers, including Archbishop Mannix of Australia are of the opinion that the "self-determination" activities of the Cohalan-Devoy group have injured the cause and created confusion among its workers.

DONNEYVILLE YOUTH DIES IN MOTOR CRASH

Lindsay, Ont., July 15.—While riding in an automobile with P. J. Lucas and James Lucas, brothers, Charles Lonney of Donneyville, 19 years of age, was killed this afternoon by a Grand Trunk railway train, which struck the automobile at the crossing at Omemee. James Lucas was injured, but not seriously. The trio were on their way home from Omemee. It is probable an inquest will be held.
