BRITISH AIRMEN AGAIN BOMBARD GERMAN POSITIONS

Much Damage to Military Establishments in Belgium is Caused

London, Oct. 28.—"Bombs were dropped on Friday night by the naval air service on the Lichtervelde railway junction," says British official statement. "Direct hits, causing a heavy explosion were followed by numerous smaller ones. The Thourout railway junction also was attacked, bombs falling close to a moving train, which stopped immediately, a large explosion being observed. The Kortemark railway junction also was attacked."

"On Saturday afternoon bombing raids were carried out on the Sarapellook airfield, the Engel airfield and the Ostend-Thourout railway line south of Egel."

"A great number of patrols were carried out. Two enemy aircraft were driven down out of control, one of them falling into the sea. All of our machines returned safely."

London, Oct. 28.—A communication issued this evening says: "Last night more than four tons of bombs were dropped on several enemy airfields, and three important railway stations. One bomb fell on a train, setting it on fire."

Longboat Not Dead

Wants to Get After Scalp of Indian Who Has Been Impersonating Him

Toronto, Oct. 29.—Tom Longboat, famous Indian Marathon runner, who has been twice unofficially reported killed in action in France, is still alive. Captain Tom Flanagan, who went overseas with the same battalion and has returned to Canada, had a letter from him on Saturday. Longboat threatens to take action against an Indian in the United States who has been representing himself as Longboat. Tom describes one of his experiences in the front line trenches and says it makes him sore to have this fellow going round the country having a good time on his reputation while he is undergoing such hardships.

BELGIANS HAD STRIKING PART IN THE VICTORY

Allies' Highly Important Success on West Front One of the Wonders of the War

British Front in France and Belgium, Oct. 28.—(By the Associated Press.) The story of the highly important victory won by the French and British armies over the marshy lands of Flanders yesterday is the record of a spectacular military operation, which before its completion would have been branded as impossible by the average expert. It is a story of men who battled their way through mud and water, through water over morasses and through water into which they sank literally to their necks at times, and with rifle and cold steel, conquered the enemy in a large and vital strip of territory which includes within its borders such places as Kippe, Merchem, Achehove, Verbranden and Kosterdalen. The striking feature of the performance lies in the part played by the Belgians in yesterday's drive. When the troops reached the neighborhood of Luyghem in the afternoon and began their assault on this place, the Belgians, who were watching from their lines across the floods, joined them, piling into ferries, poling their way to the eastern shore and hurling themselves on the Germans concealed in concrete defences in the region north of Luyghem with such good effect that they quickly mopped up this entire northern strip of the so-called Luyghem peninsula. The territory conquered yesterday is a strip of land about 7,000 yards long and varying in width from 1,500 yards at the narrowest place to 8,000 at the widest. If a line be drawn from a point just north of Langewaade westward almost to Sevekoten, this would constitute the size of the strip.

U. S. IS TO LEND VESSELS TO ITALY

Washington, Oct. 29.—The government, through the United States Shipping Board, is to turn over within the next few weeks 100,000 tons of shipping to Italy, to relieve its economic situation, which, through lack of ships, is reported serious. This will involve supplying about twenty-five steel ships.

To carry out the arrangement the government will requisition, among others, some of the Great Lakes steamers. It is in position now to turn over half a dozen big ships, and the others will be supplied, it is expected, within a month.

Italy has borrowed ships from Great Britain, using some of them to transport wheat from India. Britain's own demands, owing to the U-boat activities, have become such that she has been obliged to recall some of the vessels loaned to her ally. This deficiency the United States will make up and, in addition, furnish more tonnage.

SPAIN NOW IS FACING CRISIS

Cabinet Has Resigned—King in Conference With Political Leaders

Madrid, Oct. 29.—The Spanish cabinet has resigned. King Alfonso held conferences with various political leaders during Sunday, but the solution of the crisis promises to consume several days. It is not expected that the new cabinet will be announced before Tuesday.

Former Premier Mauri, leader of the Conservative party, yesterday sent the king a written memorandum in which he declared that the existing disorganization was due to long standing causes. He also says that whatever government is formed must "first restore discipline in the army."

Count Romanones, a former premier, in a long note to the press, calls for an immediate re-opening of parliament and the formation of a coalition government, in which all parties shall be represented. In reply to inquiries concerning his attitude, Premier Dato said: "I can say nothing. I do not see any way out of the crisis yet."

Bernstorff Now "Excellency" Amsterdam, Oct. 29.—Count Von Bernstorff has been made a "Wirklicher Geheimerat" by the German emperor, with the title of "excellency." The count is now ambassador at Constantinople.
