# POLICE FORCE OF NEW YORK TO

Board of Estimates Provides Money for Additional Patrolmen

NEW YORK, Oct. 21-The Board of Estimate has provided for the addition of 1,000 patrolmen to the city's police force January 1. It was announced by Mayor Walker at the close of the meeting that an appropriation of \$1,769,000 had been voted for that

Police Commissioner McLaughlin had asked for 2,654 patrolmen, which would have cost the city \$4,694,000. In addition, Mr. McLaughlin was granted 20 new lieutenants at a cost of \$66,000 and four new inspectors to cost \$19,600.

TOTAL \$43,711,111.

The Police Department had already been allowed a boost of \$2,547,334 in the tentative budget over last year's allowance. With the additional increase just granted the department's budget for 1927 has thus been jumped to a total of \$43,711,111 as against \$39,809,177 for 1926.
