PREMIER BALDWIN VISITING KAISER

NOCEREMONY AS HOUSE IS OPENED Parliament to Dissolve on Thursday and Election on December 5.

ATTITUDE CHANGES Premier Baldwin is Visited by Leaders of Labor Groups.

(By Canadian Press.) London, Nov. 15.—The British Parliament will be dissolved Friday and a general election held Thursday, Dec. 6.

It was expected that Premier Baldwin would make an announcement of the late of election when Parliament opened today.
