THEY WERE SENTENCED TO JAIL

That Does Not Exist.

New York, May 30.—As the result of
an error on the part of an attorney for
Borden's Farm Products Company, Inc.,
in making out a jail commitment
order, nine former employees of the Borden
company may never serve terms
averaging thirty days each, to which
they were sentenced following conviction
for contempt of court in violating an in-
junction prohibiting picketing in the
recent milk strike.

The order, which was subsequently
signed by Supreme Court Justice Nor-
man S. Dike, designated the "Raymond
Street Jail." There is no Raymond
Street Jail, that being only a popular
name for the county jail. John B. John-
son, counsel for the union to which all
nine of the men belong, raised the point
that they could not be sent to a jail
which did not exist, and carried the
point through the courts to the Court
of Appeals, which sustained his point.
