War Garden Bulletin

PRACTICAL DAILY GUIDE FOR VACANT LOT AND BACK-YARD GARDENERS EN-LISTED IN GREAT-ER PRODUCTION CAMPAIGN

Issued by the Canada Food Board in Collaboration With Experts on the Staff of the Dominion Experimental Farm

DEPTH FOR PLANTING.

It is of the utmost importance to know the most economical depth to plant potatoes, as there is no doubt that different depths of planting will give different results. While shallow planting has given the best yields at Ottawa in loose, sandy loam soil, the most economical depth is from four to five inches for rich loamy soils. Sets should be planted deeper in soils likely to dry out than in others more retentive of moisture. Where early potatoes are wanted, the sets should

be planted shallow in the warm soil near the surface. Unless the soil is kept loose and free from weeds, the potato crop will not be large.

In planting potatoes, hilling is advisable, as a larger surface of soil is exposed to the warmth of the sun, the soil is kept loose, and rain is absorbed easily. If it rains to hard the surplus is drained off. As most of the available plant food exists in the first few inches of top soil, it is natural to assume that if hilled the potatoes will grow more quickly than they otherwise would.

Notes on Garden Pests Issued By the Canada Food Board in Collaboration With the Dominion Entomologist.

CUTWORMS.

The 24th of May! One of the gala days of the year, but in war time a day that many more Canadians than usual will devote to their gardens. For those who started work early some of the first young shoots may even now be appearing, while there are others who have just reached the stage of putting in their seed.

Early though the season is, the insect world is already "on the job." Cutworms destroy thousands of dollars' worth of vegetable crops every year. Gardeners must aid in the campaign to save the crops by destroying these pests.

Watch for their appearance, as they are already at work. They cut through the stems of the young beans and tomato plants at the ground line during the night and leave the young plant dying on the ground. Investigation in the loose soil will generally discover the miscreant a few inches away, half an inch or so below the surface, when he can be summarily squashed. They can be killed wholesale by scattering along the rows poisoned bait made as follows: Bran, 20 lbs., cheap molasses, 1 quart, Paris Green or white arsenic, half a pound; water from 2 to 2½ gallons. Mix the bran and Paris Green (or white arsenic) thoroughly in a wash tub while dry. Dissolve the molasses in the water and wet the bran and poison with the same, stirring well so as to dampen the bran thoroughly. A formula for small gardens is: One quart of bran, one teaspoonful of Paris Green and one tablespoonful of molasses, with sufficient water to moisten the bran. Apply after sundown as soon as cutworm injury is noticed. There is one objection to this mixture—it is poisonous to the birds.

**MARITIME FARMERS NOT
SOWING ENOUGH WHEAT.**

Ottawa, May 23.—The Canada Food Board is in receipt of advice from Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island to the effect that farmers there are not sowing as much land in wheat as was hoped and expected. There are abundant supplies of seed in these

provinces, and the recent regulations of the Canada Food Board indicate the very great need of wheat overseas, and of the utmost production and conservation of wheat on the continent. These regulations indicate the wisdom of every farmer growing at least an acre of wheat, and those farmers who are already planning to grow large crops of wheat to increase their acreage of this cereal.

**ANOTHER APPLICATION FOR
INCREASE IN RATES.**

The public utilities commission yesterday decided that they had no jurisdiction to approve of a bond issue by the Calais Water and Power Company.

The application for permission to increase rates for natural gas in Moncton was withdrawn in order that certain changes might be made and will be presented at a later meeting.

The Sussex Mercantile Co., Ltd., presented an application for permission to increase for electricity supplied to the residents of Sussex. The hearing will be held in St. John on June 26.
