Pequegnat, commercial traveller and volunteer worker in the Stratford Association; Chris Graham, Community Y. M. C. A. secretary, Amherst, N. S.; Oscar D. Irwin, of Collingwood, Ont., student of Knox College, who is now a volunteer for association work in foreign lands.

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The Y. M. C. A. staff at Valcartier numbered forty-eight, and in one day as many as 1,000 soldiers attended Y. M. C. A. meetings.
