Your Education committee hereby submit their second report as follows:

I. The committee recommends that in answer to a communication of F. Martin, he be notified that he is required to attend four sessions, one of which may be taken in New York, together with a summer session.

2. In reference to motion of Dr. Bray to decrease the number of diductic lectures given at the medical colleges, the Committee recommends that the subject be not taken up at the present meeting of the Medical Council.

3. A communication was read from Dr. Cranston with reference to the summer session. The committee recommends that the resolution passed some years ago making it necessary to give students one year's notice of change in curriculum be placed in the Annual Announcement.

4. E. P. Gordon applies for a re-reading of his paper on Medical and Surgical Anatomy, and we recommend his request be granted.

5. Your committee recommend that Doctors Fowler, Geikie and the President be a sub-committee to re-read the various papers.

6. With reference to the Calendar, the committee recommend that all the verbal changes required to be made in the Calendar be left to the Registrar.

7. The following changes and additions were recommended to be made in the t alendar. (a) On page 9, add after the words "Medical Act in second paragraph "and further amended in the year 1887." (b) Page 12, clause 9, 10 and 11 the word "also" be substituted for the word "he" and that in clause 11 on the fourth line the word "he" be struck out. (c) That clause 7 on page 125 of the announcement, be transferred to page 13 and become clause 14 of that page. (d) That the first five lines of clause 4 on page 13 be struck out. (f) That there be added to clause, to be No. 22 on page 18, the words, 'and to be debarred from further privileges at the discretion of the Council." (g) That the Registrar instruct the examiner on Chemistry to make his examination to bear as much as possible on medical chemistry. (k) And your committee recommend after receiving the report of the sub committee to whom was committed the re-reading of the various papers, that no change be made except in the case of Nos. 371 and 373. Whom the committee recommend to be passed, one in Sanitary Science and
