LONDON, April 24—The most healthful countries in Europe, if the death rate be taken as an indication, are Sweden and Norway, says — Jules Courmont, a Frenchman who was soon a mission to Scandinivia last year and has now published his impressions. Statistics collected by him indicate that the death rate in Sweden has fallen to 14.3 a 1,000, and in Norway to 13.5. In France the average mortality 13.5.
