IN FISHER BODY CRAFTSMAN'S GUID

When 112 boy craftsmen from all parts of Canada and the United States gathered in Detroit next month for the second annual convention of the Fisher Body Craftsman's Guild the Maritime Provinces will be represented by Wilfred Côté, Laportie Avenue, Edmundston, N. B., and Howard W. Dickinson, Hartland, N. B., who carried off top honors at the district judging recently concluded in Montreal.

Second-place awards for the district went to John A. Wilson, 411 Main St., St. John, N. B., and Byron Arthur Best, Sydney, N. S. Each of these boys will receive \$100 in gold, and his model will also be judged in the international competition for scholarships, though the boys will not attend the convention. Additional awards, ranging from \$15 to \$25 were made at the following Eastern Canadian boys:

REORGANIZATION MEETS APPROVAL

Restigouche Company Bondholders Endorse Fraser Proposal Montreal, August 1st. - Holders of the first mortgage bonds of the Restigouche Company Limited, subsidiary of Fraser Companies Limited, meeting here Thursday approved the plan of reorganization of the Fraser Company.

There were bonds to the amount of \$3,734,000 represented at the meeting of \$1,387,500 outstanding. The total of the \$3,344,000 present was voted in favor of the plan as amended, no votes being cast against.
