GREW PICKED UP AT SEA

Yesterday Crew of Schooner Lottie Beard, who Abandoned Schooner Oct. 16, Landed in England.

The Lizard, Eng., Oct. 30.—The crew of the American schooner Lottie Beard

was landed here today from the British tank steamer Sylvia, Capt. Kendall

of the Lottie Beard, and his men having abandoned their vessel on October 16th.

Capt. Prouse of the steamer Sylvia, which left Port Arthur, Texas, on October 6th, by way

of Newport News, for Gloucester, England, picked up the shipwrecked crew,

who had been compelled to abandon the Lottie Beard, while that vessel was making the voyage from

New York to Augusta, Maine. The Lottie Beard was built at Fair Haven, Mass., in 1866.

She sailed from the port of New Bedford, and was owned by Mr. O. E. Kendall. Her displacement was 288 tons.
