U.S. Governor Dingley, Eastport. Will Arrive This Week.  
The S.S. Wilmore, a Furness-Wilby liner, is expected at this port this week and will load for overseas.  
Held for Lambay.  
The American tern schooner Henry H. Chamberlain arrived Saturday from New York via Boston, and will load lumber here for a Cuban port.  
New Line Launched.  
Five thousand persons witnessed the launching at Quebec last week of the S.S. Canadian Trapper, a 5,100-ton steel vessel built by the Davis Shipbuilding Company. The new craft will be ready for sea in February.  
Great Loss by Fire.  
The greater part of the plant of the Harbor Grace, N.B., Shipbuilding Company was destroyed by fire last week. Two ships were in the stock at the time, one a new one and the other being rebuilt. No estimation of the damage has yet been ascertained.  
A. "V. C." Second Officer.  
Lieut. W. R. Stewart, V. C., D. S. O., R. ... is the second officer of the S.S. Empress of France which is again

taking up her Canadian service after a war service since August 5, 1914. Lieut. Stewart was a commander of one of the "mystery ships" during the war. The Empress of France will be a frequent visitor to this port during the winter season.  
Traverse Ocean Open.  
Yarmouth in five years gone by was noted for the quick passages many of its fine vessels made, which have, in several instances, never been equaled or surpassed. We might note those of the M. and E. Lane, and Mary I. Baker, which made four round trips across the Atlantic in one year, with cargoes laying such way. Another was that of the brigantine Condor, 173 net tons, owned by Benjamin Rogers and Nathan Woodard and launched in 1837. While in command of Captain Hilton, this vessel in 1844 made five voyages to the West Indies and back in thirteen and one-half months, having loaded once in St. John, twice in St. Andrews, and once in Liverpool, N. B., stopping at Yarmouth each voyage for orders.—Telegram.
