When near Death Valley some came to the conclusion that the Mormon knew nothing about the country, o they appointed one of their number a eader, and broke off from the party.

The leader turned west; so, with the people and wagons and flocks he travelled three days and then he travelled three days and then descended into the broad valley, whose treacherous mirage promised water. They reached the centre, but only the white sand bounded by scorching peaks met their gaze. Around the valley they wandered, and one by one the men died, and the panting flocks stretched themselves in death under the hot sun. Then the children, crying for water, died at their mother's breasts, and with swollen tongues and burning vitals the helpless mothers followed. Wagon after wagon was abandoned, and strong men tottered and died. After a week's wandering a dozen survivors found some water in the hollow of a rock in the mountain. It lasted but a short time, when all died but two who escaped out of the valley and followed the trail of their former companions. Eighty-seven families, with hundreds of animals, perished here; and now, after twenty-three years, the wagons stand still complete—the iron work and tires are bright, and the shriveled skeletons lie side by side.—Beaver (Utah) Enterprise.
