Grandmother's Advice. Grandmother always knew just the proper thing for a boy to do, and sometimes she would get her grandsons together, and peering over the tops of her glasses severely, would say to them: 'Boys, if you want to be known as little gentlemen remember that the following things should be done: 'Hat lifted in saying "Good-bye" or "How do you do?'

Study Insect Pests in Annapolis Valley. DR. HEWITT ESTABLISHING AN ENTOMOLOGICAL STATION IN KENTVILLE—THE SAN JOSE SCALE. In order to study more thoroughly in Nova Scotia the more serious insect pests affecting orchards and meadows for their control, the Dominion Department of Agriculture is establishing an entomological field station in the Annapolis Valley, and in co-operation with the fruit growers will carry on experiments in other sections. Mr. Ralph Eaton has placed several acres of young orchard at the disposal of the Division of Entomology for experimental purposes. Dr. Gordon Hewitt, Dominion Entomologist, is now in Nova Scotia for the purpose of making arrangements for the carrying on of these investigations, and the location of the field laboratory, Mr. G. E. Saunders, B. Sc., field officer of the Division of Entomology will have charge of the work. In addition to investigating the more serious insect pests in order of their importance, the field station will serve as a bureau of information. This new development is part of a scheme which has been decided upon for the wider study of insect pests. A satisfactory study of these destructive agencies and measures for further control can be carried on only in the regions where they commonly occur, and for this reason a number of entomological field stations, each of which will consist of a small laboratory in charge of a trained entomologist, working under the direction of the Dominion Entomologist, are being established in those parts of Canada where they are most numerous. Nova Scotia and New Brunswick are each to have such a station. In Nova Scotia the Bud Moth and Brown Tail Moth will be studied more especially. It is also intended to study very carefully the San Jose scale situation. Dr. Hewitt, after having had the matter investigated, has been consulting with Prof. M. Cumming, Provincial Secretary for Agriculture, who has already called the attention of the fruit growers of the Province to the danger. While a very large number of the young apple trees imported from Ontario have been found bearing scales, no living scales have as yet been found. It has been decided to have the matter carefully investigated during the coming summer, and all importers of nursery stock are requested to send Prof. Cumming, Secretary of Agriculture, Toronto, notices of the amount of stock which they have imported during the past two years and the names of the nurserymen supplying the stock. Prof. Cumming will then make arrangements for the inspection of such imported stock during the months of June and July with a view to discovering whether any living scales have been imported. Should living scales be found, every effort will be made to eradicate the same and to prevent the establishment in Nova Scotia of this, the greatest and most difficult pest which the fruit grower has to contend with. The establishment of the San Jose scale in Nova Scotia would be the greatest blow to the fruit growing industry which the Province could receive.
