

1868. Subsequently called to the Bar of Ontario, and is also a Barrister of the North-West Territories. Apptd. Q.C. by the Dominion Govt., 1892. Was war correspondent for the *Irish Times* and the *London Standard* during the Franco-German War, and was wounded at the siege of Montmedy. Was sent by the Canadian Govt. to Washington, U.S., 1879, to inquire into the system of management of Indian Industrial Schools, and went to Manitoba, to take evidence on the best location for such Schools, and on his report the present successful system of educating the Indian children, was based. Was Secretary to the Royal Commission respecting the Canadian Pacific Railway, 1880-81, and Secretary to the Commission apptd. in 1884 to inquire into the Chinese Immigration question. Established the *Regina Leader* in March, 1883. Was a delegate to Ottawa, in 1884, to represent the requirements of the N.W. before the Dominion Govt. Is the author of *The Irishman in Can.*; *Eos: an Epic of the Dawn and other Poems*; *The Fair Grit*; *British versus American Civilization*; *The Earl of Beaconsfield*; *Culture and Practical Power*; *Ireland and Empire*; *France and the Westminister Rev. Can.*, 1891, &c., &c. An unsuccessful candidate for command in the Commons at g. e., 1878. First returned to Commons at g. e., 1887, and re-elected at g. e., 1891, and at last g. e. A Conservative, and favors a broad and generous policy for developing and peopling the North-West.—*Regina, N.W.T.*; *Albany Club, Toronto*.

DAVIS, THOMAS OSBORNE (*Saskatchewan*).

A native of the City of Montreal, and settled at Prince Albert about 1876. Is a general storekeeper. Has been a Councillor and Mayor of the Town of Prince Albert. First returned to Parlt. at by-election held Dec., 1896, to fill vacancy caused by Hon. Mr. Laurier, who was elected for Saskatchewan and Quebec East, determining to sit for the latter constituency. A Liberal.—*Prince Albert*.

DECHENE, ARTHUR MIVILLE (*L'Islet*).

Brother to Gilbert Miville Dechene, M.P.P. for L'Islet in Leg. Assem., Prov. of Quebec. B., 1848. Ed. in Ste. Anne's Coll. M., 1891, Aurore Ouillet. Is a lumber merchant. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1896. A Liberal.—*Village des Aulnaies, P.Q.*
