

HARRISON, CHARLES B. (*Sunbury*).

Son of the late Hon. Charles Harrison, M.L.C., and brother of Hon. A. Harrison, M.L.C. B. in Canning, N.B., 13 May, 1824. M., Charlotte, dau. of the late George Miles. A farmer. Has been a mem. of the Co. Council, and is Vice-Presdt. of the Prov. Liberal Asso. First returned to House of Assem. at g. e., 1886, and re-elected at g. e., 1890, 1892 and 1895. A Liberal.—*Maugerville, N.B.*

HILL, Hon. GEORGE FREDERICK (*Charlotte*).

S. of the late Hon. George S. Hill, barrister, who was for twenty-eight years a mem. of the Assem. and L.C. of N.B. B. at St. Stephen, Feb., 1832. Ed. there and in U.S. Admitted an attorney in 1854. Went into mercantile pursuits same year, and has therein continued ever since. Was Official Assignee in bankruptcy for Charlotte Co., from 1860 until June, 1873. Sat for Charlotte in Leg. Assem., N.B., in 1865, and was defeated at the election in 1866, when Confederation was carried. Re-elected and sat from g. e., 1878, until apptd. to the Leg. Council, 25 May, 1882. Was Speaker of the Leg. Council from 3 March, 1887, until its abolition in 1892. Re-elected for present seat at g. e., 1892, and again at g. e., 1895. A Liberal.—*St. Stephen, N.B.*

HOWE, WILLIAM T. (*York*).

S. of the late Thomas Howe, Adjutant of H. M. 34th Regt. B. at Fredericton about 1835. M. Miss Donald. Is a farmer, and Major in 71st Batt. of Militia. Has been a Municipal Councillor and Warden of his Co. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at g. e., 1892, and re-elected at g. e., 1895. A Conservative.—*Stanley, N.B.*

JOHNSON, URBAIN (*Kent*).

Of Scotch descent. B. at St. Louis, Kent Co., in 1824. M., Mathilda LeBlanc. Is a farmer, and has been a Magistrate for 42 years, a Municipal Councillor for 12 years, and Warden of his Co. for 2 years. Is Lieut.-Col., in Reserve Militia. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at g. e., 1892, and re-elected 1895. A Conservative.—*St. Louis, N.B.*

KILLAM, AMASA EMERSON (*Westmoreland*).

Paternal grandf. was an officer in the British Army, and served during the American War of Independence, afterwards settling at Sackville, N.B. B., 25 Aug., 1834. Ed. at the public schools. M., 1st, 1857, Miss M. Wheaton;
