First returned to Parlt., for present seat, at g.e., 1867; re-elected by acclamation at g.e., 1872, and again at last g.e. METHOT, FRANCOIS XAVIER OVIDE. (Nicolet.)

Youngest s. of the late F. X. Methot, who represented Quebec in the Parlt. of old Canada, from 1847 to 1851. B. in Quebec, A19 Sept., 1843. Ed. at the Quebec Seminary. M., May, 1864, Marie Elora, fourth dau. of the late A. P. Methot, Esq., who sat for Nicolet in Can. Assembly from 1844 to 1847. Represented Nicolet in Quebec Assembly from g.e., 1871; re-elected at g.e., 1875. Returned to House of Commons for same county, 18 Dec., 1877, on the appointment of Mr. Gaudet to the L.C. of Quebec. Has been Mayor of St. Pierre les Becquets for several years; is a Justice of the Peace and holds a Captaincy in the Militia. An Independent Conservative, and in favor of a judicious protective tariff.—St. Pierre les Becquets, P.Q.
