SMITH, THOMAS BARLOW. (Hants.)

S. of Bennett Smith, Esq., and M.P.P., shipowner and head of the large shipowning firm of Bennett, Smith & Co., Windsor, N.S. B. in Windsor, 28 Oct. 1839. Ed. at Windsor. M. in Windsor 6 April 1864, Miss A. Scott, dau. of the late David Scott, Esq. Returned to Parlt. 4 March 1874, Prov. N.S., Co. of Hants, Local House. Sat one session, 1874. Defeated by a small majority at g.e. 17 Dec. 1874. Again returned at last g.e. A Liberal.—Windsor, N.S.
