in the fidelity, ability and integrity of you, the said
James George Aylwin Creighton, We have nominated, con-
stituted, and appointed, and by these presents do nominate, constitute and appoint
you, the said *James George Aylwin Creighton*, to be Master in the Chancery of Our
Dominion of *Canada*, to attend to Our said Dominion, and to do, perform
and execute all such acts, services, matters and things in Our Parliament as apper-
tain to the said office, and as you shall be required and ordered to do in the said
office of Master in the Chancery by us, or by the said Senate of *Canada*, sitting in Our
Parliament of Our said Dominion, giving and granting to you power and authority
to exercise and perform all the said duties of the said office, place, and trust of Master
in the Chancery of *Canada* belonging.

To have, hold, exercise and enjoy the said office of Master in the Chancery of
Canada, for and during Our will and pleasure, with all the rights, powers and authori-
ties, fees, perquisites, profits and emoluments which to the said office do belong, or
ought to belong or appertain.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent,
and the Great Seal of *Canada* to be hereunto affixed. WITNESS, Our
Right Trusty and Well-Beloved Councillor, Sir JOHN DOUGLAS SUTHER-
LAND CAMPBELL (commonly called the Marquis of Lorne), Knight of
Our Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle, Knight Grand
Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of *Saint Michael* and *Saint*
George, Governor General of *Canada*, and Vice-Admiral of the same.
At Our Government House, in Our City of *Ottawa*, this twenty-seventh
day of June, in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred
and Eighty-two, and in the Forty-sixth Year of Our Reign.
