To have, hold, exercise and enjoy the said office of Master in the Chancery of Canada, for and during Our will and pleasure, with all the rights, powers and authorities, fees, perquisites, profits and emoluments which to the said office do belong, or

ought to belong or apportain.

In Testimony Whitehor. We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. Withhus, Our Right Trusty and Well-Beloved Councillor, Sir John Douglas Strans-Land Campbell. (commonly called the Marquis of Lorne), Knight of Our Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistie, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Ching George, Governor General of Canada, and Vice Admiral of the saint At Our Government House, in Our City of Ottown, this twenty-eventhed and Fighty-two, and in the Forty-sixth Year of Our Reign.
