and if such Acte or Actes be not found, shall give a Certificate or Certificates thereof to any person or persons requiring the same, and of all Actes which shall be found enrolled, every Register is hereby authorized and required to give compleat and perfect Copies together with Copies of all memorials and certificates endorsed thereon by virtue of this Act, or Copies solely of the memorials and certificates endorsed thereon by virtue of this Act, if such only be required, to any person or persons requiring the same respectively, upon payment of the fees by by this Act directed.

X. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that every such Register shall be allowed for the insinuation of every Acte, the and no more; for every Certificate of Insinuation, the sum of and no more; for every other Certificate the and no more; for every Search, the sum of and no more; for every Copy of an Acte or other paper enrolled in his office, (insinué) the sum of and no more-If the Copy delivered does not exceed two hundred words, and if such Copy shall exceed two hundred words, the further sum of per hundred, and no more, for all the words contained in such Copy over and above the first two hundred words.

XI. And whereas Notarial Actes are at all times, liable to be destroyed by fire and other accidents; Be it therefore further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that in all cases in which any Notarial Acte shall have been destroyed by fire or other accident, and a Copy or Expedition of such Notarial Acte so destroyed, shall have been duly enrolled (insinué) according to the provisions in this Act contained, the Copy or Expedition so enrolled (insinué) of such Notarial Acte so destroyed by fire or other accident; and all Copies of such Copy or Expedition so enrolled (insinué) duly certified to be such, under the signature of the Register, by whom such Notarial Acte was enrolled, or his successor in office, shall be received and allowed as good and sufficient evidence as well of the making and execution of such Notarial Acte by the parties thereunto, at the time and place and in the manner and form as by such Copy or Copies shall appear as of the contents of such Notarial Acte, so destroyed by fire or other accident, until the contrary shall be proved in the due course of Law.

XII. And it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that if any Register shall willfully neglect to perform his or their duty in the execution of his Office according to the requirements and directions in this Act contained, or shall wilfully commit or suffer to be committed
