Panelists will include Dr. Edgar Freden berg of Buffalo State University, author of "The Vanishing Adolescent" and an expert in education; Dr. E.H. Humphries of Peel County Board of Education, Maurice R. McLuhan, assistant researcher for University of Toronto's Centre for Culture and Technology and Cliff Maynes, a student at Super School in Toronto, a free school.
