Diane Archer and Linda Pallett also participated in the presentation. It was the second year the girls had done something special for the holiday season.

"Last year Debbie and I didn't have anything to do so we decided to try and do something nice for Christ-

mas," explained Ellen. "We went around to all the hospitals hoping to get to do something for kids who don't get out for the holiday. The hospitals were almost all booked up, but we finally did a show for some small kids in the Queensway Hospital. But they were too small to understand what went on."

"This year we approached an old age home but that fell through. Fortunately, the Extendicare people were more than willing to help us."

The girls tried to collect money through their high schools but since the project was not for the student's use, they had to rely on the generosity of their trailer park neighbors to raise the \$43 they managed. Although they have not decided what the project will be, the girls from the trailer park are sure they will find somebody to help next Christmas.

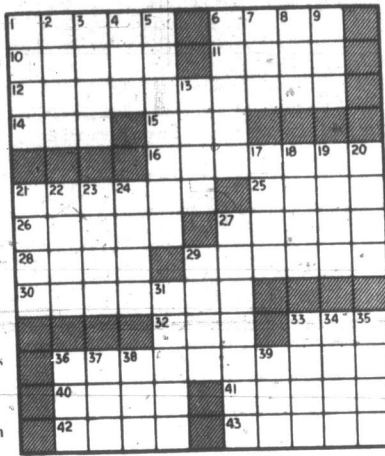

Backing into a bizarre problem is sometimes the best way to solve it. Just ask Mississauga Police Constable Michael Wood, who spent 15 minutes Thursday running around backwards trying to grab the free-swinging door of a car that went wild in the Mississauga Hospital parking lot.

The car spent about 30 minutes careening around in reverse on a path over a traffic island at the physiotherapy entrance on the east side of the building. To try and stop the vehicle, which was going about 15 m.p.h., police and tow truck operators had to race backwards as fast as possible and avoid the flapping open door, while attempting to get into the 1970 Chevrolet Nova.

They finally managed to end the chase when a young tow truck operator lifted the car's hood and it hit the curb at a different angle, straightening out momentarily. Constable Wood then jumped into the vehicle and applied the brakes.

Miraculously, there was no damage. The Nova missed traffic signs and nearby parked cars. "I had visions of it hitting the hospital," said Constable Wood.

When it was over, the constable still couldn't accept what had happened. "You had to see it to believe it, I'm still amazed. I can't figure out why it kept going in this same little circle."

The driver of the car, E. J. McGirr of 811 Parkland Ave., was picking up his wife from the hospital when the joy ride started.

"If you don't give it a good shove, it stops halfway between park and reverse. When I slammed the door, the car must have jumped back into reverse, and off it went."

With the experience over McGirr laughed: "That's the best entertainment this hospital has had for a while."
