Uplands, Ontario	November 18th 1943		Cloudy. A concert recital was held in the Recreation Hall tonight. Selections from Brahms, Standel, Schumann, Beethoven, Mendelssohn were played, but, although the quality of the music and the artists was excellent, the attendance was somewhat disappointing. The artists were Neil Chotem, pianist; Frederick Skitch, pianist; Jack Neilson, violinist; Donald Pringle, baritone and a quintet of wind instruments - Messrs. Baas, Rabinovitch, Bonner, Goodwin and Mosher.		
	November 19th 1943		Cloudy to overcast. Hazy, becoming less hazy. The usual Friday night dance was well attended by Station personnel and their friends, music being supplied by an Ottawa orchestra. Lunch was served.		
	November 20th 1943		Overcast with snow flurries in Killaloe area. Wing Commander H.M. Wilson assumed temporary command of the school, vice Air Commodore A. Raymond, appointed A.O.C., No. 3 T.C. "Ladies Day" starring Lupe Velez and Eddie Short, was the movie shown in Recreation Hall.		
	November 21st 1943		Cloudy to overcast. Snow continuous late in day. Regular church services held. Flight Lieutenant J.A. Koffend of No. 3 Training Command officiating at the Protestant service. J26378, P/O Ross, W.A., with R201028, LAC Otton, W.K., under instruction, while flying Harvard 2933 during a snow squall struck a tree in the vicinity of Richmond, Ontario. Category of accident - "D-4". No injury to pilot or student.		
	November 22nd 1943		Overcast to partly cloudy. A variety show sponsored by the girls of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company put on an excellent performance to an enthusiastic and capacity audience.		
	November 23rd 1943		Cloudy to overcast. "Meanest Man in the World" starring Jack Benny and Priscilla Lane was the movie shown. The Station Basketball League got underway tonight, opening games being played between Band and Maintenance No. 1 and between Maintenance No. 2 and Maintenance No. 3 teams.		
	November 24th 1943		Partly cloudy. Graduation dinner for Course 87 was held in the Officers' Mess. The Air Officer Commanding, A/C Raymond, the Commanding Officer, W/C Wilson, and the Chief Instructor, S/L Haylett, spoke to the graduates. The dinner was followed by a dance in the Recreation Hall and a thoroughly enjoyable evening was had by all.
