Dear Mr. Meighen:

I arrived last Wednesday and have been heart-sick at conditions here so far as speeding-up war is concerned. "Here fiddles while Rome burns" is the important element and if Parliament cannot do it; then the citizens of Canada should unite to compel that waste of time should cease!

Yours is not an appeal at the eleventh hour to you; as a public man. I've tried for years to try and tell Canadians what I found out in Post-war Immigration; and to get the Canadian Government, editors etc, to waken and try and get a construction grasp of these problems - especially <sup>to secure</sup> ~~to secure~~ <sup>to secure</sup> ~~to secure~~ for western Canada, to take the place of those who had not returned from the Great War.
