Dear Mr.Meighen,-

I have your letter of March 18th in regard to Fred Brook of Boissevain. The facts of the situation are as follows:

The post office lot in the town of Boissevain is much the best lot in the town and was purchased at big expense about 1913 by the Dominion Government with the purpose in view of building a post office. Owing to conditions caused by the war, construction was not proceeded with.

During the time that James Steedsman was the Member for Souris, the Board of Trade of Boissevain constantly asked him to take the matter up with the Department with a view to having the post office built - but he would not even answer their letters.

Subsequently, through the intervention of the said Mr.Steedsman, a lease of the property was obtained in the name of a Boissevain syndicate, the ringleaders in which were Mr. Duncan Henderson, who ran against my father at the last provincial election and Dr.F.V.Bird, prominent Liberal whose father at one time was Liberal member. This syndicate built a small tin building on the lot and rented it to Mr.Brook. My partner,
