British Court's Memorial,

Delivered to the French MINISTER, the 24th of July, 1749, in answer to those, presented on the king's part, concerning the Settlements projected by ENGLAND.

THE king, having made some reflections on the memorial presented to his excellency the duke of Bedford, the 7th of last month, by the sieur Derand his most christian majesty's chargé d'affaires at the court of England, has ordered, that a representation should be made to the said chargé d'affaires, in the following manner, of the several observations, which appear necessary to be made, on the said memorial.

The two points, concerning which the most christian king desires an explanation, viz. the settlement of Acadia, or Nova-Scotia; and the project ascribed to Mr. Dobbs, are so little liable in themselves to any objection on the

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
