Delicate Cake,

Perieste Cake.

From a new cookbook this recipe for old fashioned white cake or delicate cake is taken: Cream together a cupful of butter and two of sugar; then add slowly a cupful of sweet milk and the whites of eight eggs beaten to a stiff froth. Finally mix in three cupfuls of sifted figur in which have been mixed three teaspoonfuls of baking powder. Stir as little as possible. Flavor with a teaspoonful of almond extract. Sometimes a cupful of blanched and chopped almonds is added at the last. When such a cake is feed and crnamented with whole blanched almonds an orthodox christening cake is produced.

Often your prettiest cut glass vinegur cruet becomes ruined because the stopper suddenly becomes immovable and no power on earth short of breaking seems to move it.
