CAP. VI.

An Act for the better regulation of Licenses to Inns, Taverns and Houses for selling Strong Liquors by Retail. Passed the 7th of March, 1814.

HEREAS the Laws concerning the Licensing of Inns, Taverns Premble. and other Houses for felling strong or spirituous Liquors by retail are defective or infufficient for the preventing or correcting abuses and disorders therein-

I. Be it enacted by the President Council and Assembly, That from No License to be granted and after the passing of this Act, no License shall be granted to any for keeping an Inn or Person to keep an Inn or Tavern, but at the General Sessions of the Peace, to be holden in and for the several and respective Counties in Licenses to be for one this Province; and that all Licenses shall be made for One year only. year ealy.

II. And be it further enacled, That no Person or Persons to whom a Persons having retail Li-License shall be granted at any General or Special Sessions of the cooles nor to sell any Peace, to sell Wine, Ale, Beer, Brandy, Rum, or other strong or spiplanting describe spenly of the cooles for the cooles for the cooles of the cooles for rituous Liquors by retail, shall be allowed or permitted to sell the Twenty Shillings, fame under the quantity of One Pint; and if any fuch Licensed Perfon or Persons shall fell any Wine, Ale, Beer, Brandy, Rum, or other firong or spirituous Liquors by retail in any quantity less than One Pint, every Person so offending shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay the fum of twenty fullings, to be recovered upon complaint to be recovered on commade to any of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace in the County plaint made to a Justice where such afforces thell his committed, when the cath of one or more of the Peace. where fuch offence shall be committed, upon the oath of one or more credible witness or witnesses, and levied by Warrant of distress and fale of the offender's goods under the hand and seal of such Justices, directed to any Constable of the Town or Parish where such offence shall be committed, tendering the overplus, if any, after deducting the costs and charges of such distress and sale to the offender; and if If no Goods sound whereno goods shall be sound whereon to levy such distress, it shall and on to levy, the offender may be lawful for such Justice by Warrant under his hand and feal to Good for a term not excommit such offender to the Common Gaol of the County where ceeding Five days, fuch offence shall be committed without bail or mainprize for such time not exceeding Five days, as fuch Justice shall in his discretion
