CHAP. 44.

An Act to authorize the Corporation of the Town of Emerson to construct a Free Passenger and Traffic Bridge over the Red River in the Province of Manitoba

[Assented to 7th May, 1880.]

WHEREAS the construction of a free bridge over the Red River, a navigable river, at the Town of Emerson in the Province of Manitoba, will greatly tend to promote the welfare and intercourse of the inhabitants of the said Town and the country to the west thereof, and will provide a market easy of access to such inhabitants west of the said Town, and tend to the convenience of the public generally; and whereas the Municipal Council of the said Town of Emerson has, by a petition under its corporate seal presented by the said Council for that object, prayed to be authorized to construct a free bridge over the said Red River at the place above mentioned: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Preamble.

1. The said municipal corporation of the said Town of Emerson is hereby authorized to erect and construct, maintain and manage, at its own cost and expense, a solid and sufficient free bridge for ordinary carriage and passenger traffic over the Red River at such point in the said Town of Emerson as the municipal council thereof shall deem proper, together with all necessary dependencies and approaches, as well as to do all such other matters and things, as shall be necessary, useful or advantageous, for erecting, constructing, keeping up, maintaining and managing the said intended bridge and other dependencies, according to the true intent and meaning of this Act.

Bridge may be built at Emerson over the Red River.
