The motorist whose car has not been nore than a few miles from home but evertheless gets a polite invitation to appear before a magistrate several hundred miles away in the other end of the province, can in future afford to smile : t An inconspicuous amendment of the last session to which the Highway De. partment is drawing the attention of the motoring public removes the necessity for a motorist travelling to answer a speeding charge of which he is not guilty In future where the defence of the motorist is that his car was not in the municipality from which the summons came, and that there is evidently an error in taking the number, he may appear before a local justice of the peace with two witnesses and prove his contention. If the local J. P. is satisfied he must issue a certificate which, when sent to the J.
