KOOTENAY'S TRIUMPHANT HOUR, THE MINER has a great piece of news for its readers this morning. It is nothing less than the statement from Ottawa that the government has arrived at an agreement with the Canadian Pacific railroad for the immediate construction of the Crow's Nest Pass railroad, and that it has closed an arrangement with the Columbia & Western (F. Aug. Heinze's railway) for the immediate building of a line from the Columbia river to Penticton.

Our special despatch and the regular press report give the complete details of the agreement with the C. P. R. and we have no hesitation in saying the agreement means more to the Kootenays, more to British Columbia and the whole of the Dominion of Canada than anything that has happened since the confederation itself. It means more than the building of the original line of the Canadian Pacific, because the Crow's Nest line is fraught with greater possibilities in the way of the development of the natural resources of the western provinces and the building up of a great exchange of trade between the eastern

and western provinces. The cut rates from eastern points from the Canadian Pacific mean a revolution in the merhantile life of the country. Indeed the significance of the concessions made in this direction can hardly be comprended at once. The concessions to the farmers of Manitoba and the Northwest means a saving to them of \$500,000 on this year's crop and twice that sum next year.
