
SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS The sole head of st family, or any male The sole head of si family, or any male over 18 years old, new homestead a quar-ter-section of available Dominion land in altoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Ap-olicant must appear if person at the Do-minion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but sot Sub-Agency), on certain conditions. Duttes-Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

Live stock may be substituted for culti-vation under certain conditions. In certain districts a homesteader in Rood standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price 8:00 per acre

section alongside his homestead.
\$3.00 per acre, Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent, also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead tent on certain con-ditions.

A settler who has exhausted his home-stead hight may take a purchased home-stead in cretain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre.
