FOE DESTROYERS SMASHED BY FIRE OF BRITISH SHIPS

Naval Raid Attempted off Dover by the Germans Resulted in Disastrous Flight; Enemy, Superior in Numbers Fled Before British

London, April 23.—Five German destroyers attempted a raid on Dover the night of April 20. Two British boats engaged them, sinking two and perhaps three of the enemy boats, according to the official announcement, and putting the rest to flight. Over 100 Germans were saved by the British from the two destroyers sunk, and the bodies of some thirty others have been brought in by trawlers.

Fire Prevention Subject of Consideration at Simcoe These Days

Simcoe, April 23.—Naturally recent catastrophes here have resulted in considerable discussion of town as to necessary precautions beforehand, and assistance during the progress of a fire. Among matters that we have heard mentioned are those of private dwellings and managers of industrial concerns and their superintendents should know exactly the location of every gas and water cut-out at the street lines and these should be clear of snow and ice at all times of winter, and the caps should be kept on and the tubes free from stones in summer.

GERMANS KILL THEIR FELLOWS

Large Number of Wounded Teutons on Torpedoed Hospital Ships

SHOWED COWARDICE And Rushed for Boats When Ship Was Sunk

BRITISH WERE CALM Stood at Attention as Vessel Went Down

London, April 22.—The British hospital ships Donegal and Lanfranc with many wounded aboard, have been torpedoed without warning. They were sunk on April 17, off those on the Donegal 29 wounded men and 12 of the crew are missing. The Lanfranc carried German wounded as well as British. Of those aboard 19 British and 15 Germans are believed to have perished.

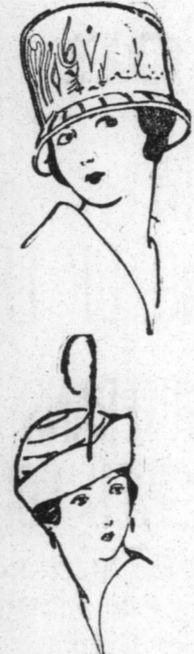

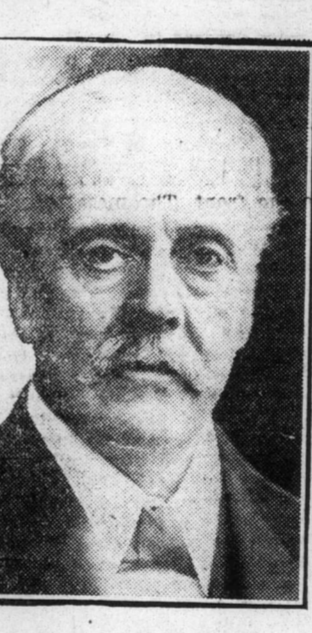

CANADIAN NORTHERN

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, who has homesteaded a quarter-section of available Dominion land in British Columbia or Alberta, or who has applied to purchase a quarter-section of available Dominion land in the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for such a quarter-section, may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions:

1. Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years after the date of homestead or purchase, or a certain number of days in each year, as follows:—(a) In the first year, at least 90 days; (b) in the second year, at least 180 days; (c) in the third year, at least 180 days. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$20 per acre. Dotted—Six months residence in each of three years after the date of homestead, or a certain number of days in each year, as follows:—(a) In the first year, at least 90 days; (b) in the second year, at least 180 days; (c) in the third year, at least 180 days. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
