## BRAVE CANADIANS.

Boers Made a Determined Attack on Their Position.

Enemy Repulsed With Heavy Loss—Lieuts. Burch and Borden Among Our Killed.

London, July 19.—The War Office has received the following despatch from Lord Roberts:—

"Pretoria, July 18.—Yesterday the enemy made a determined attack on the left of Pole-Carraw's position and along our left flank, commanded by Hutton.

"The post held by the Irish Fusiliers and the Canadian Mounted Infantry, under Lt.-Col. Alderson, was most gallantly defended.

"The enemy made repeated attempts to assault the positions, coming in close range and calling to the Fusiliers to surrender.

"The enemy suffered severely. They had fifteen killed and fifty wounded and four were taken prisoners.

"The British casualties were seven killed, including the Canadian Lieutenants Borden and Burch, thirty wounded and twenty-one missing.

"Jan Hamilton's column advanced to Waterval yesterday unopposed, and to-day proceeded to Hamman's Kraal.

"Fifteen hundred Boers, with five guns, managed to break through the Gordon formed by Hunter's and Randle's divisions between Bethlehem and Ficksburg. They were making towards Lindley, closely followed by Farget's and Broadwood's brigades.

Note.—Lieut. Burch, mentioned among the killed, was a brother of Mr. Burch, who has been filling St. Andrew's pulpit in this city.

HE WAS PROVIDED FOR.

A Pretoria despatch of Wednesday says:—Mr. J. M. A. Wolmarans, of the Transvaal Executive Council, has been arrested at his house within the British lines, near Hatherley. Boer gold worth six thousand pounds and a quantity of arms were found concealed in the house.

In a despatch dated to-day Lord Roberts pays a tribute to Lieuts. Borden and Burch, whom, in his despatch given above, he reported killed. Lord Roberts says: "They were killed while gallantly leading their men in a counter-attack on the enemy's flank at a critical juncture of their assault on one position. Borden was twice before brought to my notice in despatches for gallant and intrepid conduct."

## THOSE WHO VOTED

Against Prohibition in the House of Commons

Condemned by the Dominion Alliance—To be Opposed Next Election.

Toronto, July 19.—The Ontario branch of the Dominion Alliance at yesterday's convention had a rather interesting discussion as to how prohibitionists should go on record as to the Dominion Government's actions. The Government was condemned for defiance of public opinion, and instruction was given the committee of the Alliance to take immediate steps to provide for the organization of the Province, to secure the defeat in the approaching general elections of all members of Parliament who have failed to recognize the mandate of the electors regarding prohibitory legislation, and not to vote for any candidate of either party who is not known and valued prohibitionist, and who will not agree to support such measures.

delegates as too mild, and Mr. Daly, of London, moved in amendment to add the words:—"That we urge all friends of temperance throughout the Dominion to withdraw their support and influence from the Government now in power."

After a lengthy debate, in the course of which the secretary, Mr. Spence, said there were many Conservative prohibitionists who had never given the Laurier Government their confidence, and therefore could not withdraw it, the amendment was voted down and the report adopted.

The convention decided unanimously to ask for an Ontario prohibition at the next session of the Legislature, and also to oppose the withdrawal of temperance text books for the schools and the sale of liquor at military camps.
