To Succeed Sir Douglas Hazen According to Latest Reports at Ottawa

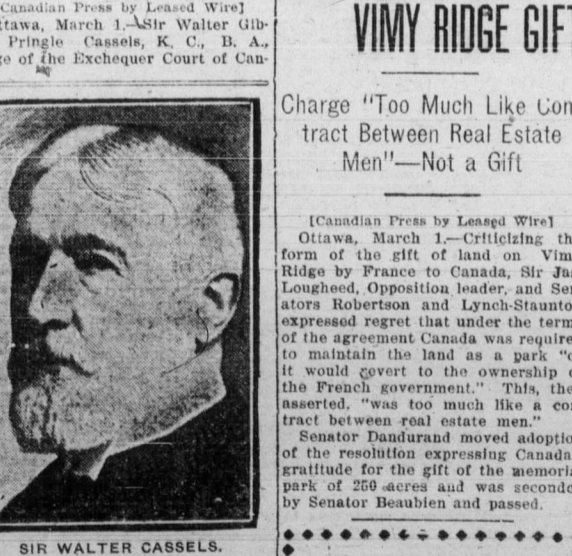
