PEERS TREADING ON COMMONS' TOES

House of Lords Take Unprecedented Action in Amending Old Age Pensions Bill.

London, July 23.—The House of Lords has taken important steps regarding the Old Age Pension Bill and one which will bring them into direct and violent conflict not only with the majority in the House of Commons, but with Socialists and Laborites throughout the country.

CABINET MEETS FRIDAY. First Meeting Since Prorogation to Take Place on Return of Ministers.

Ottawa, July 23.—Sir Wilfrid Laurier and the other members of the cabinet who are now out of the city, are expected to return on Friday next and the first cabinet council since prorogation is reported to be held on Friday afternoon. The government has many items of public business requiring attention, and cabinet council will be held for a fortnight. One of the most important matters to be taken into consideration is the appointment of three new members of the board of railway commissioners, as provided in the act recently passed.

VICTIM OF HIS ENEMIES. Hawkesbury Farmer Suffers Loss of Cows From Paris Gasm.

Vanklev Hill, Ont., July 23.—Malcolm McCollum, who resides in the fourth concession east of Hawkesbury, about six miles from Vanklev Hill, had three cows and three horses poisoned by some unknown party leaving Paris Green in the pasture. Some one also tried to burn down Mr. McCollum's barn but the fire was discovered in time. McCollum married a daughter of Alex McKenzie, of St. Anne de Prescott, a few weeks ago and it is reported that prior to the wedding she was told that if she married McCollum that she would have no luck. It is reported also that McCollum found a note posted on the fence saying he would have more trouble. This happened after the first cows died.
