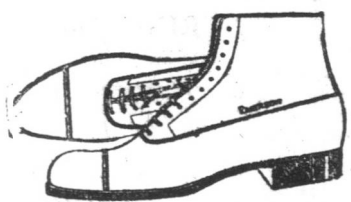

National Anthems and Their Origin.

How various national anthems originated is told in an article on the music page of the Fort Worth Record by H. Vian Hamilton, composer and pianist, who is passing the summer in Fort Worth. Mr. Hamilton's article follows:
“Many are the political vicissitudes and technical mutations which a national anthem undergoes before it arrives at that state of perfection which endures forever and causes the patriotic heart to beat with a pride that defies the name of its author to a place among the immortals.
“And many are the famous names associated with the national hymns down in their accepted versions all over the world.
“Several bars of the Marseillaise

one of the most stirring of all, would not be recognized by Rouget de Lisle if he heard it as it is sung to-day.
“On the other hand no improvement could be made in the Austrian hymn which was not the only immortal creation of so accomplished a musician as Haydn. The fate of the Napoleonic hymn ‘Partant pour la Syrie,’ is now probably sealed forever and there are few people who can hum the forgotten melody to-day. It was written by Queen Hortense, daughter of Empress Josephine by her first husband, General Beauharnais and the wife of Napoleon's brother, Louis.

She, however, has a place in history which the faithlessness of man to her effort will not erase.
“So trivial is the Italian hymn that it is as well not to inquire the composer's name, and it is to be regretted that Verdi perhaps the most prolific melodic composer the world has ever known, when asked by Victor Emmanuel II. to write one, was so modest as to declare that he did not feel equal to the task.
“The British National Anthem is probably the oldest unless some Oriental nation can give theirs that distinction. The earliest version dates further than the twelfth century, when it was exhumed in a coffin in Yorkshire, and bears little resemblance to the well known version of to-day.
