EUROPEAN NEWS. Madrid, Oct. 5.—The Provisional Junta has requested Marshal Serrano to take charge of affairs until the meeting of the Cortez; and he has consented so to act with Gen. Prim and Olozuge as his colleagues. The formation of the new Gabinet has not yet been completed. General Escalanta, a democrat, has been placed in command of the National Guard. It is daily becoming more and more evident that the great majority of the people are in favor of a republican form of government for Spain. The Duke of Vittoria and the Count of Cheste have declared that they will support the existing Provisional Junta. Copenhagen, Oct. 6.—The King delivered a speech yesterday at the opening of the sessions of Rigadag, in which he said that the negotiation with the Prussian Government in matters of Schleswig Holstein had been thus far without result. It was the desire of the Denmark Government to preserve peaceful relations with Prussia. The ratification of the sale of St. Thomas and other islands in the West Indies to the United States has been postponed by the Rigadag for one year.
