Sam returned from the meeting last night, and although rather reticent about going into particulars, it was learned that the dove of peace which fluttered around the table at Moose Jaw, did not stay for long.

The meeting at Moose Jaw was more in the order of a truce signing affair than a real peace conference, and there will be another meeting of the board of control probably on Tuesday, July 1, in Medicine Hat. At this meeting things will be thrashed out in a very thorough manner, and some momentous questions decided.

The most serious feature of the whole thing was the suspending of Ray McNamee, manager of the Edmonton team, which was suspended for violating the rules. Everyone would have thought that this would have been the last word in the matter, but Mr. Savage says that the league will be in a very bad way if the suspensions are not lifted.

Saskatoon and Regina Are Sorry, and President Frank Is Forgiving; Whisman, Hurley and Hulen Are All Reinstated; All Clubs Will Be Playing Game Today

MOOSE JAW, June 22.—At a conference of the officials of the Western Canada Baseball league held here Saturday night the difficulties of the league were thrashed out and aired so thoroughly that the atmosphere has been cleared and all clubs will be back on the diamond and playing Monday.

Upon the trouble concerning the Saskatoon and Regina clubs being brought up the past action of President Gray was thoroughly endorsed by the remaining members of the board of control. The representatives of both the Regina and Saskatoon clubs present expressed their regret that the misunderstanding and difficulties between their clubs and the president had occurred, and Mr. Gray, in view of their explanation, and with the interests of organized baseball at heart, has agreed to overlook the past and start all teams to work at once.

Manager Bill Hurley and the Saskatoon team, together with Managers Hulen of Regina and Whisman of Edmonton have been reinstated upon probation. It was predicted that a meeting of the league would settle the difficulties, and it has done so.
